Notes for Franz Anton Albert MAMBOURG:

There are three general lines of Mambourg families in the United States. Most families with the surname Mambourg originally came from the Belgium area. I found the Mambourg surname dating back to the late 1700's in the Netherlands (now Belgium) and the early 1800's in Prussia (now part of Belgium and Germany). The geographical boundaries of countries changed significantly during the 1800's and early 1900's. There are a number of people with the Mambourg surname living today in both Belgium and France.

One Mambourg line in the United States is Leopold Mambourg and traces back to Liege, Belgium. I have not proved that we are related to the Leopold line.

The other two lines in the United States are from brothers Joseph and George Mambourg. Joseph came to the United States in 1888. George was probably born in Asselborn, Luxembourg. We know for sure that his older brother Joseph was born in Asselborn, Luxembourg in 1865. I [Roger Rowland] have the original birth certificate for Joseph Mambourg, which was hand written in German, and has been translated. Based on the birth certificate we know about their parents. Their father Frantz Mambourg was born from Eupen, Prussia (now Belgium).

In 2002 I found out indirectly, that Joseph and George probably had a least four other siblings.

Also of note is that Asselborn, Luxembourg and Eupen and Liege, Belgium are within seventy-five miles of each other.

Based on stories told to my Aunt Helen Proctor when she was young, Joseph and George immigrated to the United States to avoid the military draft. I have obtained some anecdotal information that seems to support that story. The information describes immigration "push and pull factors" from Luxembourg to the United States. When Joseph and George immigrated they came to Chicago, Illinois. Chicago was a immigration destination for many people from Luxembourg coming to the United States. Both of the brothers were married in Chicago. Joseph was married in 1895 and George in 1893. The immediate descendants of George stayed in the Chicago and Hammond, Indiana areas. The descendants of Joseph migrated to Colorado, California, Ohio, and Texas. Joseph Mambourg died and was buried in Colorado.

Mambourg in western Europe generally refers to a chief government official of a town or canton (much like we use the term Mayor). Mambourg also refers to a geographical section within the wine producing area in France. I have not been able find how our family came by the name.

The information for Franz his parents, his wife and her parents, and their children other than Joseph and George comes from Thommes Web Site of MyHeritate.com that was last updated on Sep 13 2015. That site includes 34,750 profiles in 3 family trees. The Mambourg information appears to have been extracted from registers in Asselborn, Luxembourg. The actual connection to Jos Thommes is not clear. The records have not been independently verified. That is way all dates are indicated "Abt." I had been aware there was an extensive family in Asselborn, Luxembourg based on previous research. This tree also appears on Ancestry.com.

Zelma was born and raised on a farm. The farm was located on Cable Road and Spencerville, on the west side of Lima, Ohio. Jack Coon owned five acres. He worked also worked on the farm across the road. In 1915 they moved to 538 McPheron Avenue in Lima, Ohio.

Zelma said that when she was young the family did not have much money. The kids had shoes for school. However, they had to take off their shoes when they got home. That way the shoes would last longer.

Zelma's brother went to town to earn more money. Jack Coon was only paid five dollars a week at the time. Zelma's brother was earning more money in town. Jack could not work the farm by himself and moved the family to town.

Zelma got acquainted with George Mambourg through John VanROOYEN. John married Zelma's sister Olive. Zelma only knew George a week when they were married.

Zelma and George lived at 105 Condit Street in Hammond, Indianna. They could walk to the cemetery where Olga [KUEHNEL] MAMBOURG is buried. They moved to a farm south of Lima. They had chickens and sold eggs. They kept a journal of the eggs that were laid and sold. George also did machine repairs to help earn a living.

The family moved to Columbus Grove (12-15 miles north of Lima). They lived their sixteen and a half years. The first world war started and George and Ray went to work at the Ohio steel mill. Ray was taken into the service. George then bought a farm south of Lima. The farm was 83 acres on route 65. The family lived there for twenty six and half years.

Zelma has saved several items of memorabilia. She has journals that George and she had kept. One journal includes the income and expenses of George's work. Most significant, is the lock of hair she saved from her daughter Mary Jane.

Zelma received a certificate from the "First Families of Allen County." The certificate reads as follows. "This is to certify that Zelma Orfa Coon Mambourg is a descendant of the following pioneers who lived in Allen County, Ohio, before 1840: Alexander Coon." Certificate #383, date approved June 1, 1976. Signed by J. A. MacDowell, President, Allen County Historical Society and Agnes Hower Wells, President, Allen County Genealogical Society.

Zelma said the caretaker of the Shawnee Cemetery said there were over 100 persons buried in the cemetery with the Coon name. Some are related to Zelma's family many are not.

These notes and the notes for George came from two days of interviews of Zelma Mambourg by Roger Rowland during September, 1997. The interviews were done at the home of Coyne and Helen Shoemaker with Helen present both days.

The following history was taken in part from the funeral service for William.

In 1903 he left England and went to Canada where he worked as a farmhand for several years. In December, 1909 he forfeited a homestead entry for the NW 1/4 of section 4, township 9, range 13, west of the 1st meridian. This is confirmed in a letter dated October 10, 1910 from the Canadian, Department of Interior.

Soon after his conversion, he felt the call to preach the gospel. For his Theological training he came to Chicago, Illinois, on December 13, 1913 to attend the Moody Bible Institute, from which he graduated in 1916. The date of entry is confirmed with a "Declaration of Intention," which was filed in the circuit court of Polk county, Wisconsin on April 2, 1918.

After graduation, Mr. Rowland served as a missionary in Wisconsin. He became a licensed preacher in the Methodist Church on August 24, 1917. At that time he was Pastor of the Methodist Church in Clear Lake, Wisconsin.

He then became affiliated with the Baptist denomination in which he served in several pastorates. He was duly ordained to the Baptist Ministry on September 7, 1923. Mr. Rowland and his family moved to Denver, Colorado in May, 1924.

At age 52, Mr. Rowland received his United States citizenship on December 19, 1938. In Denver, he was employed by Swift & Company until the time of his retirement December 31, 1951. While employee at Swift and during World War Two, Mr. Rowland served in the Auxiliary Military Police.

Although, Mr. Rowland left the pastoral ministry when coming to Denver, he served as a guest speaker and supply minister on many occasions, and preached in the various missions in Denver. He never ceased to be an avid Bible student. He was affectionately known by his coworkers at Swift as "Preacher Bill."
