Alfred was born in London, England on April 13, 1858. He came to Glenboro in the fall of 1907 and farmed in the district until 1913 when he took up his trade as a painter and decorator and continued this until his retirement in 1933. He was very active in church work, having been a lay preacher for a number of years and served on the United Church Board for many years. He was secretary of Sunday School and taught a boy's class.

His wife predeceased him in 1896. He lost two sons in infancy and his daughter Alice, Mrs. F. C. Beech died in

February of 1949. Surviving at the time of his death were one son, William, of Denver, Colorado, and two daughters, Lily and Florence. Lily and Florrie were both born in Westminster, London, England. Alfred died in December 1949.

The following history was taken in part from the funeral service for William.

In 1903 he left England and went to Canada where he worked as a farmhand for several years. In December, 1909 he forfeited a homestead entry for the NW 1/4 of section 4, township 9, range 13, west of the 1st meridian. This is confirmed in a letter dated October 10, 1910 from the Canadian, Department of Interior.

Soon after his conversion, he felt the call to preach the gospel. For his Theological training he came to Chicago, Illinois, on December 13, 1913 to attend the Moody Bible Institute, from which he graduated in 1916. The date of entry is confirmed with a "Declaration of Intention," which was filed in the circuit court of

Polk county, Wisconsin on April 2, 1918.

After graduation, Mr. Rowland served as a missionary in Wisconsin. He became a licensed preacher in the Methodist Church on August 24, 1917. At that time he was Pastor of the Methodist Church in Clear Lake, Wisconsin.

He then became affiliated with the Baptist denomination in which he served in several pastorates. He was duly ordained to the Baptist Ministry on September 7, 1923. Mr. Rowland and his family moved to Denver, Colorado in May, 1924.

At age 52, Mr. Rowland received his United States citizenship on December 19, 1938. In Denver, he was employed by Swift & Company until the time of his retirement December 31, 1951. While employee at Swift and during World War Two, Mr. Rowland served in the Auxiliary Military Police.

Although, Mr. Rowland left the pastoral ministry when coming to Denver, he served as a guest speaker and supply minister on many occasions, and preached in the various missions in Denver. He never ceased to be an avid Bible student. He was affectionately known by his coworkers at Swift as "Preacher Bill."

Lily was employed at various homes and nursed during the "flu" epidemic of 1918. For nine years she was an ardent worker for the Red Cross during that time she knitted over 150 pairs of socks, and also was in charge of articles of sewing for the Red Cross. She was very active in former years in the work of the Anglican Church having been a leader of the G. A. for some time, a most enthusiastic member of the W. A. and sand alto in the choir.

During the Second World War, Lily was name recruiting officer for the army, for this area; and was active in the Legion Auxiliary; Canvassed for various organizations. She was interested in Drama, and took part in several plays. In her later years she was confined to home and later to the Senior Citizens Home, where she pursued her hobby of knitting and crocheting.
